#### GRIEF SUPPORT GROUP HERE AT FIRST UNITED

Grief is a normal emotional response to significant loss. The abnormality of grief is frequently a consequence of the refusal to grieve or the inability of the grieving person to find those willing to care. Grief is universal and inescapable. Grieving is the intentional work grief stricken persons engage in enabling them to return, eventually, to full and satisfying lives. Guilt, shame,

loneliness, anxiety, anger, terror, bewilderment, emptiness, profound sadness, despair, helplessness, are all a part of grief, and all are common to being human. To explore these feelings, we are starting a Grief Support Group here at First United. The first meeting will be held on October 10<sup>th</sup> at 7:30 pm in Trinity Hall.
